

## **KEY HIGHLIGHTS**


- It took the Memphis MSA 10 years to recover jobs lost to the Great Recession, but only 2 years to recover from the pandemic. Feb 2020 to Feb 2022. On the other hand, the US took 2.5 years for pandemic job recovery: Feb 2020 to Aug 2022.
- •Jobs in the US exceed the pre-pandemic high by 0.6%, whereas the Memphis MSA has seen job growth beyond the pre-pandemic record at 2%.
- •US Real Nominal GDP grew by 9.6% between 2020 and 2021. The Memphis area nominal GDP grew by 10.1%
- Memphis was named one of the best (#4) cities for jobs in 2023 by Glassdoor with two Memphis companies ranking among the best employers, St. Jude (#25) and FedEx (#31).

### **UNEMPLOYMENT RATE TRENDS**


Memphis, TN-MS-AR had a September 2022 unemployment rate of 4.14%, decreasing from 4.34% 5 years before.







# STUDENT LOANS ARE A BIG RISK

AVERAGE PAYMENT = \$393 / MONTH

43 MILLION HOUSEHOLDS ARE AFFECTED

\$ 393 \* 12 \* 43 MILLION = \$ 202 BILLION OR 0.8% OF 2023 Q3 GDP

IN Q1 2021 36 MILLION HOUSEHOLDS LOST \$250 A MONTH IN CHILD CARE CREDIT WHILE 65 MILLION RECEIVED A 5.9% COLA ON OASDI BENEFITS. ADD IN 2% TAX HIKE ON WEALTHY = -1.6% IN REAL GDP



# THE DRURY RULE

- WHEN PREDICTING A RECESSION OR BOOM, ONE MUST IDENTIFY THREE INDUSTRIES OR THREE REGIONS WHICH WILL CRASH OR SOAR – AS EXTREMES INFLUENCE THE AVERAGE
- TODAYS LOSERS: HOUSING BUT NOT AUTOS, CAPITAL SPENDING AS A LAGGARD
- TODAYS WINNERS: ENERGY, AGRICULTURE, DEFENSE, SEMICONDUCTORS, AUTOS, STATE & LOCAL GOVERNMENT, NONPROFITS (10.9% IN Q3)
